9:45 – 11:45am	Day 2: The Business Case for Employment Equity There appears to be a gradual shift in Canadian organizations from a compliance-driven focus to a business-driven focus on workplace diversity. However, the data is clear on employment equity for Black, indigenous and people of colour. Leadership in most Canadian organizations are not reflective of the country's population. An opportunity exists for organizations to better manage the diversity of their workforce and gain a strategic advantage in the competition for talent from an increasingly diverse labour market. Industry leaders will share their viewpoints on how corporate Canada can
